# Our May Lunch Meeting will be the Annual Scholarship Fund Awards



This year the NWFMOA is awarding scholarships worth over \$50,000. For 2025 we had 10 competitive applicants competing for the 8 NWFMOA scholarships. Seven cadets will receive a \$6,000 scholarship (\$3,000 a year over two years) and the highest ranked cadet will receive the "Lt. Col., USAF, Ret., James and Mrs. Una Heavener Memorial Scholarship" of \$9,000 (\$4,500 a year over two years). The winner will be announced at the May luncheon. In total, we will be giving out \$51,000 to these outstanding JROTC cadets. We will also be awarding one \$4,000 scholarship to a ROTC Cadet entering his junior year of college this fall. As we started doing last year, some of this year's scholarships will be named to honor the memory of deceased Chapter members.

In addition to the members attending, there will be many of the Cadet's family members also attending the ceremonies, so be sure to make your reservations well ahead of time. Please join us for our **May 1st** lunch which will start with a social gathering at 1130 with



## Chaplain's Corner

### **Easter Reflections**



My grandparents came to this country right before World War I. They began their journey at the US consulate and met with a staff member. To prepare for this major

shift, they were given a booklet to read, paperwork to fill out and eventually several interviews. They did it the right way and arrived in Boston and opened a business. Their wise choice produced a family line of doctors, lawyers, university professors, departmental chairman, businessmen, to name a few.

When I was ready to go to college, I requested a catalog, read about the history of the school, the various departments and a myriad of subjects and well-respected academic professors. I was required to meet with a counselor to review my initial plan of study and major/minor subjects. I paid the required fees and bought lots of textbooks. We met regularly to re-evaluate my grades and course recommendations for the optimal approach.

When we wanted to buy a house, we went to the real estate office, and they gave us several booklets about their company, neighborhood schools, businesses and additional relevant demographics. We filled out paperwork, wrote lots of checks, met with lawyers, bankers, inspectors and neighborhood leadership. We followed the state's requirements.

When the Lord spoke to me about being a military chaplain, I was interviewed by 3 colonels. Yes, they wanted paperwork, to hear what my goals were and what vision and contributions I could contribute to the core and my country. One asked for my faith testimony.

Every base I served at, young man and woman who wanted to be married had to review the HC booklet if they desired a God-centered chapel wedding. It laid out the purpose of marriage; there was a 8 page questionnaire they were required to fill out.

After the initial interview, there was a pre-wedding course that they took for several months, and then it was up to the discretion of the chaplain whether they would officiate their union in the base chapel.

We were serious about marriage, and we knew the ramifications of those who were ill-prepared. (The majority of our counseling cases revealed the lack of preparation.) Eventually, they were taught God's purpose and given counseling tools that would hopefully provide for a successful and meaningful relationship for the spouses and their children. They had faith, knowledge and a mentor to guide their 'ships' before they left the harbor. Many believe the model of marriage as a horizontal reflection of our vertical relationship with God.

Now, if we make a paradigm shift from the worldly to the spiritual, and you want to have a long, extended, peaceful mind-frame, as we journey through this life into the next, it's important to learn about the author who created this vast universe. God formed us in our mother's womb, ordained our purpose, and offers us new life. The Bible provides guidance and examples for our daily living.

In order, to cross this final border into His 'Promised Land', one has to read the book, meet with local representatives-ministers and priests to learn about membership in the family of God.

We do it for all these earthly institutions that require a process, an interview, and a responsible commitment on our part.

However, many avoid this parallel approach. They don't take seriously their finitude, the afterlife or the Eternal Spirit.

Yes, there's a wall between earth and heaven, and God would love all of us to come live there. "He wants none to perish." It's as fluid as the above scenarios.

Maybe you live in a gated community; heaven is, definitely, a gated community!

What is true and legal for foreigners who want to become American citizens is true for those who want to be heavenly citizens. You cannot enter heaven illegally. St Luke's story of Lazarus and the Rich man clearly demonstrates who goes to heaven and who goes to hell.

Let's not play with fire. Remember we humans have a 100% mortality rate- that is no one gets out of this world alive. Remember our soul is eternal and lives on, some will retire in one of two locations. The choice is ours; not to choose, is making the 'worst' choice!

You just have to read the book and have an interview with his Son and have all your thoughts and motivations of the heart in the right place.



Annual NWFMOA Scholarship & Awards Luncheon, May 1, 2025

Another year has passed and we have a new group of Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) cadets who are graduating from high school. Many of these cadets will soon be entering their colleges of choice, others have already enlisted in the military services, and some are seeking employment or have jobs lined up. Whatever the category, we congratulate all as they finish their high school years and advance to new challenges. Through our NWFMOA Scholarship Fund we try to help a few of those graduating cadets who will be attending college with their expenses of tuition, room & board, books, or other of the many costs of getting a college degree by awarding scholarships. These cadets will enter their college's ROTC program in anticipation of becoming commissioned officers in a military service.


