The year and the direction we pursued can best be summed up as *Comradery With Purpose*. Here are some of the highlights from 2023. As we have in the past, we will continue to build upon these impactful events as we strive to make a difference in the lives of others as we celebrate 65 years of serving our local community in 2024.

Year 2023 in Review:

Increase the awareness of being a NWFMOA Member

- -Implemented free luncheon meal during Member's birth month.
- -Monthly trivia question in *The Defender*...get it correct and have your name drawn at the next meeting to win a free lunch. Must be present to win. (This is just one of the many contributions made by Fred Westfall).
- -Created a calendar of events...posted on NWFMOA Webpage.
- -Launched our Facebook page. (Huge kudos to Jim Shoff for making this happen). Everyone is invited to post information that you feel is important to NWFMOA. We welcome pictures and stories from the past and present. This is our page to communicate with each other and the community.

Membership

- Added 23 new Members.
- Established New Member Welcome Aboard feature in The Defender.
- Established Member Spotlight feature in The Defender.
- Hosted Officer Calls...great time and place to share stories from our time in uniform. (Kudos to Dick Solt for leading this effort).
- The Annual Military Ball was a resounding success. Karl Eschmann spearheaded the event and was helped by several Members...Dave Swanick, Dave Parisot, George Colton, Fred Westfall, and numerous others who donated items for the auction. Money raised will be used to fund Chapter initiatives in 2024.

Increase Community Outreach Impact

- Partnered with Longwood Elementary School and Bob Hope Village and initiated Valentines for Veterans...125 handmade Valentine Cards were made and delivered by the Longwood 2nd Graders to residents of Bob Hope Village.
- Awarded \$29,500 in scholarships. (Great job NWFMOA Scholarship Fund)
- Participated in FWB Chamber's Veterans Appreciation at the Landing.

- Applied for and received two MOAA National Grants. Was one of only four Chapters nationwide to receive two grants. (Huge kudos to Dave Parisot for writing and submitting the grant application).
 - o Received a \$2,300 grant for the Veteran Standdown. Outfitted 58 Veterans with jeans, hoodies, underwear, socks, hats, and gloves.
 - o Received a \$1,500 grant to purchase Commissary Gift Cards at Thanksgiving for E-4 and Below families. During the first three years of this initiative, we reached a total of 598 junior enlisted families. In 2023, we leverage the \$1,500 grant and raised an additional \$6,000 thereby allowing us to reach 300 junior enlisted families. (MOAA Foundation, NWFMOA Members, and the local community are commended for their incredible generosity).
- Chuck Merkel was the Master of Ceremonies for the Fort Walton Beach Chamber of Commerce's 50th Anniversary Celebration of the Repatriation of the Vietnam War POWs.
- We partnered with the DAR in conducting their Recognition Ceremony for Veterans of the Vietnam War. Jeff Watson served as the moderator, while Karl Eschmann, Patrick Johnson, and I served as panelist. Many of our Members were personally recognized for their service during the Vietnam War...We greatly appreciate every one of you and your service!

- 3 Chapter Members were recognized with MOAA National President's Leadership Awards (George Colton, Dave Parisot, Fred Westfall).

- Karl Eschmann was recently nominated for the DAR Outstanding Veteran Volunteer Award.

Our Chapter continues to do well thanks to the hard work of many. I want to especially thank the Board (Karl Eschmann, Fred Westfall, George Colton, Ray Alexander, Bob Allen, Bob Gramm, Michael Griffith, and Dick Solt) for their leadership and help in guiding our Chapter. While in college in the 60's, I worked in a health food store. The manager was fastidious and tedious--"Azar, make sure you check the dates on all merchandise; it could affect customers health and our financial future."

I checked the stock out on the floor and backrooms. I enjoyed working in a NYC restaurant as it provided good lessons, thoughtful friends and meeting

people from all over the world. He taught me to make wise, disciplined health choices.



While in the Air Force, I pointed out to staff that the chapel refrigerator and freezer contained pot luck items from events we hosted-from CC and NCO senior staff meetings, weddings and funerals, to deployed spouses and children luncheons. Items were way past their expiration date. Our staff concluded it was time to jettison these outdated to-go containers. God forbid someone got sick from chapel food.

Fast forward 20 years to a visit to my parent's home. After years of having my children checking the dates on food in our pantry and refrigerator, they pointed out ancient dates on grandma and grandpa's shelves. "Waste not want not" is uprooted by good dietary health voices.

I'm sure you have noticed every item in your home has "sell by, use by, or best buy" dates. Modernity looks out for humanity. Doctor's offices send us reminders so we stay current, hence healthy. Our cars flash red lights on the dash that the oil, transmission, tires need an appointment, hence safety. In the military airmen were responsible for inspections on machines and aircraft flying hours to prevent accidents. Yes, even our credit cards have month and year stenciled right on front.

Well, all this to say- even we humans have one. It's not tattooed on our body. Aware and wise humans are careful to eat right, exercise, take meds, avoid stress, stay socially connected. Wise friends tell us to avoid certain foods, beverages etc. We know death awaits us all.

NWFMOA presents More Commissary Gift Cards for Junior Enlisted Families; Officers Call at Doc's Oyster House; 'Spotlight Table' at FWB Chamber; Opus One performs at December Luncheon; and, Wreaths Across America and our Military Ball.

On December 14th, our Chapter wound down our activities by celebrating the Christmas season at our annual Military Ball. Shown below are some of those present wearing their mess dress attire. Attendance topped 50 this year.



On December 1st, our Chapter presented more **Commissary gift cards for junior enlisted families at Duke Field and the 7**th **Special Forces Group (A)** (see photos below). (See the November 2023 Defender issue for article and more photos.) This is the fourth consecutive year that NWFMOA has done this project to assist young military families. Started in 2020 with Community Outreach grants from the **MOAA Foundation**, donations by Chapter members, and donations by local businesses and military non-profit organizations, our Chapter has provided a total of 900 Commissary gift cards of \$25 each to enlisted families of ranks E-4 and below and distributed by the First Sergeants Associations at Eglin, Hurlburt, the 7th Special Forces Group (A), the 919SOW First Sergeants Council, and via the Commando Airman & Family Support Group at Hurlburt Field. By partnering with these military organizations, we better assure that the needlest junior enlisted families (airmen and soldiers) in ranks E-4 and below receive the food purchase assistance provided. The total monetary value of these Commissary gift cards is \$22,500. THANK YOU to all who have supported this worthwhile program. We plan to do it again in 2024!

We also had a guest from the **American Legion Post 325** on Hollywood Blvd. in Fort Walton Beach, attend the December 7th luncheon. **Sergeant First Class David McMillan**, US Army, Ret., presented a check of \$500 to Chapter President Fran Hendricks in support of our Community Outreach Project to purchase Commissary gift cards for junior enlisted families. Eckhoff VFW Post 7674 Auxiliary, both in Mary Esther; **Moose Lodge 2193** in Fort Walton Beach; the **Eglin Chapter of the Air Force Association**; the **Emerald Coast Military Affairs Council** of Fort Walton Beach; and, the **Navarre Beach Area Chamber of Commerce**. The donations from these organizations coupled with our MOAA Community Outreach grant and the **high donations from Chapter members** made this the best year ever for this project and provided 300 gift cards totaling \$7,500 for junior enlisted families, plus a "leg up" for our 2024 project. Our thanks to Chapter President **Fran Hendricks** for his actions in reaching out to multiple civic/military organizations. **THANK YOU! THANK YOU!** to all who donated.

On November 30th, the Chapter held its **quarterly Officers Call** at **Doc's Oyster Bar** in Valparaiso. About 30 Chapter members and spouses gathered for a fun evening of camaraderie, food and drinks. Our thanks to **Dick Solt** for setting up and coordinating this event. (See photo below)



On December 1st, our Chapter had a 'spotlight table' at the Greater Fort Walton Beach monthly breakfast at the first Baptist Church Community Center. We had an information table and chapter President Fran Hendricks made a short 'stage presentation' about what we do and addressed the many community outreach activities our Chapter does each year for the local community, e.g., the commissary gift cards for junior enlisted families, Wreaths Across America, Valentines for Vets at Bob Hope Village, Veterans Stand Down, and the Scholarship Program for local JROTC cadets at seven local high schools. The December Chamber Breakfast was attended by about 300 local business leaders in a festive holiday atmosphere.

This year's **Wreaths Across America** was held on Saturday, December 16th, at the Beal Cemetery in fort Walton Beach. This is the second consecutive year that NWFMOA has participated in this program to place holiday wreaths on the graves of Veterans to recognize their service to our country. At the Beal Cemetery alone there are over 1,800 Veterans interred, but in 2022 only about 1,200 received a wreath. Last year we funded 20 wreaths; this year our Chapter increased our purchase to 66 holiday wreaths in partnership with the Choctawhatchee Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Our thanks to Chapter members who attended the service at the Beal Cemetery in Fort Walton Beach and laid holiday wreaths on our Veterans' graves.






