What's Up With Mental Health?

We are truly fortunate this month to have the privilege of hearing Mrs. Virginia Barr speak to us about the state of mental health in Okaloosa County. Hopefully I won't be stealing her thunder; however, mental health is a growing concern as 1 in 5 American adults have a mental health condition. According to Mental Health America, Florida ranked 33rd in prevalence of mental illness and lower rates of access to care.

On a personal note, Virginia is a military brat. Her father served in the Air Force and retired out of Tyndall, AFB as a CMSgt. Virginia's husband was also in the Air Force, and served in Vietnam. He received OV-10 training at Hurlburt.

Virginia Glynn Barr, Academy of Certified Social Workers, is the Executive Director of the Mental Health Association of Okaloosa and Walton Counties. She earned her degree, from the University of West Florida, and received her master's degree in Social Work Administration.

Mrs. Barr, a clinical social worker, worked with persons experiencing

severe and persistent mental illness in the state hospitals of Alabama and Florida prior to accepting a position with the Okaloosa Guidance Clinic, (now Bridgeway Center) as the director of Emergency Services designed, developed, and directed a Geriatric Residential Treatment Facility located in Crestview, FL.

She was inducted to the Okaloosa County Women's Hall of Fame, served as a past president of the Junior League, was elected President of the University of West Florida National Alumni Association, and was selected for

New Dental and Vision Plan

Effective Jan. 1, 2019 the TRICARE Retiree Dental Plan (TRDP) will cease to exist, and will be replaced by the Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP).

OPEN SEASON TO SELECT A NEW PLAN IS 12 Nov 18 - 10 Dec 18

Dental Programs

FEDVIP has a total of 10 different dental plans to choose from, depending on your location. Plans can be found at https://tricare.benefeds.com

Most plans offer a standard or high level benefit. The high level plan usually has a lower co-pay for covered services, more covered services, and a higher monthly premium. All plans also offer 3 different types of family coverage (Self, Self plus 1, and Family)

Coverage

Unlike TRDP, many FEDVIP dental plans have no deductible, the amount you must pay out-of-pocket before insurance kicks in. While TRDP also has a maximum payout of \$1,300 per person each year, FEDVIP usually has a higher maximum and some plans have no limits.

And if you need a filling you would pay 20 percent of the cost under TRDP, under FEDVIP you normally pay nothing if using a network dentist.

If you need crowns, dentures, or braces the coverage is similar under both plans. Some plans normally require

you to be enrolled for 12 months before they will pay for orthodontics. When switching from TRDP to FEDVIP make sure you pick a plan with no waiting period if you want that treatment covered immediately.

Premiums

Like TRDP, the FEDVIP dental plans have different costs depending on where you live. In the 32578 zip code, monthly premiums range from \$19.87 - \$39.41 for and individual to \$59.63 - \$139.21 for family coverage.

Vision Programs

The existing TRICARE benefit of one eye exam each year is not going away. This new vision plan is voluntary, and allows you to get expanded vision coverage.

FEDVIP has a total of 4 different dental plans to choose from, depending on your location. Plans can be found at https://tricare.benefeds.com

Each plan offers a standard or high level benefit. The high level plan usually has a lower copay for covered services, and a higher monthly premium. All plans also offer 3 different flavors of family coverage (Individual, Self plus 1, and Family)

Premiums

Monthly premiums range from \$6.70 to \$14.43 for self only to \$19.46 to \$43.38 for family coverage.

Coverage

All plans give you one eye exam, and a pair of glasses or supply of contact lenses each year. The participating eye doctors and retailers vary by plan, as do the copayments and the quantity of contact lenses or types of glasses you are able to purchase.

To find out more go to: https://tricare.benefeds.com Here you can check out and compare all the plans based on your zip code. This will take time to sort through all the information. While many plans appear the same at first glance you may notice that your favorite dentist isn't available under one, or another plan may not pay for the contact lenses your daughter prefers.

You have to make a decision soon though. You can only sign up for both dental and vision insurance during the open season timeframe which lasts from 12 Nov to 10 Dec. After that you are pretty much stuck in your decision until next year's open season.
